

## Project's Content

The project is aimed at summarizing the activity of Russian companies in the ASEAN markets and the activity of ASEAN companies in the Russian market.

The students will analyze and systemize the presence of Russian companies in Southeast Asia and Southeast Asian companies in Russia to finally draw up the corporate map of Russia-ASEAN business presence.

The project corresponds to **the aims of the Russia-ASEAN Commemorative Summit held in Sochi** in May 2016 to study possibilities to establish an FTA between ASEAN and the Eurasian Economic Union.



## Project Main Goal

## Objectives

 Make a comprehensive outline of Russia-ASEAN B2B activities before and after the establishment of the Eastern Economic Forum;  Identify ways for Russian and ASEAN companies to contribute to the decision of the Russia-ASEAN Commemorative Summit (Sochi, May 2016) to strengthen economic cooperation between ASEAN, SCO and EAEU;

 Identify the points of convergence of Russia-ASEAN priorities and strategic planning, distinguish the sectors where Russia-ASEAN cooperation is – or could be – most commercially promising;

• Distinguish key Russian and ASEAN companies and their leaders, reveal the possibilities and limitation to strengthen their ties;

• Define the prospects of Russia-ASEAN business cooperation in the forthcoming project the Greater Eurasian Partnership.

• Preparing academic, expert-analytical, reference and applied materials in the English language.





• Searching for and processing statistical information.

#### The Format of Presenting Results, Which Are Subject to Evaluation

 <u>Midterm</u>: a presentation of individual research results, including a report about the completion of a task assigned by the head of the project. Tasks will be formulated and assigned in working order.



• <u>Final</u>: a presentation of the group project results in the form of a tentative version of the longread's individual parts.


## Grading Criteria

• Non-triviality of the conclusions and assessments.




